

The Art and Science of Guitar-making

7.30pm Saturday, 25th November, 1995

or our next Club Evening on 25th November we have invited one of the most scientifically orientated and innovative guitarmakers in the south of England - Stuart Adamson - to talk about and demonstrate his radical approach to guitar construction.

Stuart studied guitar-making with Richard Schneider in the States, and has developed Schneider's innovative techniques in his own designs. Schneider has been experimenting with braced softwood backs, and repositioning of the soundhole to increase the vibrating area of the soundboard, and it will be interesting to see how far Stuart has taken these ideas.

He will be bringing some of his guitar-making equipment with him, and no doubt there will also be the opportunity to play one or two of his instruments later in the evening.

Both Schneider and Adamson gave lectures at West Dean this summer. Some of our members, who heard Stuart, have said what a fascinating lecture he gave, so we look forward to his visit with great anticipation.
